


Pro bono hours per year harnessed by CLCs


Legal Aid Granted by Law Type (LACs)

- ✓ A single person who is employed but his/ her monthly income is less than 100,000 kyat (100 usd)
- Married person who is employed but whose total household income is less than 300,000 kyat or more if they have school age children, or a disabled or sick person in their family
- Children, Woman, disable are eligible for legal aid without a means test




Organization Chart




Organization Structure






Result of the Cases




Type of Cases (Head Office)






Type of Cases (Khayan)




Hlaing Thar Yar Satellite Office



Result of the Cases for HTY




Type of Cases (HTY)








