What is Decriminalization of Abortion?

- **Decriminalization:** Abortion is not under the ambit of country's criminal, penal legal framework.
- "Partial decriminalization":
 liberalization of restrictive abortion
 laws but abortion remains punishable
 under the law in certain circumstances.
- "Full decriminalization": Removal of abortion from criminal law framework.
 No one- pregnant persons, health-care providers, or others- is subjected to criminal or punitive sanctions for seeking or performing abortion or assisting for it.

Why Decriminalization of Abortion?

- Criminalization does not stop abortion; it only makes abortion unsafe
- Criminalization violates Human Rights
- U.N. treaty-monitoring bodies and experts have repeatedly recognized the harm resulting from criminal abortion laws
- U.N. human rights bodies and experts have recognized States' obligations to decriminalize abortion
- Access to safe abortion is essential to realization of the full range of human rights.
