Addressing Security Issues and Privacy Concerns

ATTORNEY-CLIENT PRIVILEGE

- A <u>communication</u> between attorney and client;
- Made in confidence;
- For the purpose of seeking, obtaining or providing legal assistance to the client.

WAIVER OF THE ATTORNEY-CLIENT PRIVILEGE

- When the communication is <u>not made in confidence</u> = <u>waiver</u>
 - For example, inadvertently allowing third party to overhear

DUTY OF CONFIDENTIALITY

- Ethical obligation to keep private almost all information related to representation of the client, even if that information did not come from the client.
- Typically part of Rules of Professional Conduct.

- Communicating and "meeting" with clients
 - Video-conferencing
 - Phone and text
 - Social media
- Documents
 - Sending
 - Storing
 - Obtaining signatures



Providing Legal Services Remotely

BEST PRACTICES

- Video-Conferencing
 - Location avoid open or public Wi-Fi spaces
 - Think before you record a video-conference
- Email Communication and Text Messaging
 - Use anti-virus software
 - Use secure/encrypted communication channels
- A Special Note about Social Media Social media platforms are generally <u>public</u> – BE VERY CAREFUL!
- DO NOT sent privileged communications, share confidential information, or transmit documents through social media
